Student Scholarship Application

Purpose:

Paul Angelucci had an incredibly positive impact on Shenango Wildcats over two generations. His love, generosity, and passion for the Shenango community and student body were continually displayed during his time as a student in the district, an alumnus, and an employee. The purpose of this scholarship opportunity is to support and further inspire the aspirations of graduating Wildcats who have embodied the spirit and work of Paul during his years at Shenango.

The quantity and amount of scholarship(s) granted each year depends on fundraising efforts' income and the quality/quantity of student applications. It is the scholarship committee's goal to provide two \$2000 scholarships annually.

The selection committee reviewing applications will be a committee designated by the Paul Angelucci Memorial Scholarship account holders.

Applicants should remain anonymous to the selection community until after scholarship distribution decisions have been made.

The selection of student(s) to receive scholarship grants shall be made by the selection committee without regard to the applicant's race, religion, gender, or political/economic views.

Eligibility:

Applicants must be a senior at Shenango Junior-Senior High School who plans to continue their formal education following graduation and were involved in one or more of the following opportunities as a student: Drama Club, Musical, Art Club, Chorus, Band, Auxiliaries, Wildcat Mascot, STEAM, or as a Team Manager. The Paul Angelucci Memorial Scholarship will *not* be based on academic performance or intended field of study.

Application:

1. Applications are due at the date listed in the top right of the page.
2. Applications are available in the High School Guidance Office.
3. Completed applications should be returned to the Shenango Guidance Office, which will forward all applications to the Paul Angelucci Scholarship Committee.
4. A successful applicant will receive recognition through the school district's award programs if applicable.
